Topics

This term we will explore 2 very exciting topics:

Me and My Community

Through this topic, your child will learn about the school community and build friendships. They will explore the school grounds and find out about all the people in school who are there to help them. The children will explore how they are special and unique and how everyone's family is different. They will take part in practical activities to support them to build new friendships and explore what makes a good friend.

Once Upon a Time

Through 'Once Upon a Time', your child will be introduced to the wonderful world of stories. They will listen to a range of traditional tales and have the chance to act out the stories in their play. The children will also listen to alternative contemporary stories to see different viewpoints from the characters. They will use the stories to think about how life has changed from when the stories were written. We will make up stories together and make masks, props and puppets to act out their stories.

Reading

At Manor, we promote the love of reading by sharing a daily story with the children and exploring new words. To support us, try to spend at least 5 minutes per day sharing stories with your child.

Top Tip: A story before bedtime is a lovely way to relax before going to sleep!

Lastly...

Please remember to put names in coats, scarves, hats, gloves, jumpers etc. Red jumpers/cardigans all look the same and many children have the same coat. The children will go outside (under the shelter if it is raining heavy), so please make sure they are wearing clothing to keep them warm.
