

# 12 rules for responsible ICT use

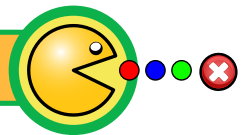
Keeping safe:

These rules will keep everyone safe and help us to be fair to others.



We will only delete our own files.

We will only use the school's computers for schoolwork and homework.



We will not look at other people's files without their permission.

We will keep our login and password secret.

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We will not bring files into school without permission.

We will ask permission from a member of staff before using the Internet and will not visit Internet sites we know to be banned by the school



We will only e-mail people we know, or our teacher has approved.

The messages we send, or information we upload, will always be polite and sensible



We will not open an attachment, or download a file, unless we have permission or we know and trust the person who has sent it.

We will not give out personal information – such as our name, address, phone number, email – or send photographs or videos, to people we don't know and trust.



We will not arrange to meet someone we have only been in touch with online, unless we have our parents' or carers' permission and they can be present.

If we see anything we are unhappy with or we receive a message we do not like, we will not respond to it but we will tell a teacher / responsible adult.
