Phonics and Reading: Our Curriculum



At Manor we recognise the importance of achieving competency in the English language as a key life skill. Our children are taught the skills needed to confidently converse with others and have their voices heard. Our systematic approach to phonics and developing early reading ensures our children have the confidence and skills to access challenging texts, whilst reading for pleasure, meaning and understanding across all key stages. We ensure our children have access to a range of literature throughout their school life to ensure that upon leaving, they are able to read at age related expectations but also have developed a love for reading that will continue. Our learning environment is vibrant with vocabulary relating to our current learning evident to inspire a love for words. Our culture of developing a love for reading also permeates our school with cosy reading areas and reading seen as a high priority in all lessons.

Impact

- Are able to read confidently with understanding using prosody.
- Are developing a deep understanding of the impact vocabulary has on their wider-life and communication skills.
- Are developing the skills to become competent readers with the ability to share their knowledge about different genres with their peers, teachers and families.
- Are developing the skills of informed choice by being exposed to a variety of quality texts and authors.

Our results show progress over time with our Key Stage results being consistently at or above national.
