



We provide all our children with a challenging, engaging safe environment which promotes a lifelong love of learning





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
Our School Aim

We want children to have a strong sense of the tools they need for later in life. We want them to be well rounded individuals not just academically but be able to transfer these skills into the wider world.




Children care about themselves, their friends, their family, their community and their world.

Children are able to have a go at anything. When they struggle they learn the tools of how to overcome it and know how to do it again next time without giving up.








Children respect themselves, their friends and adults. They think about their own words and how this may hurt other's feelings.


When you hear the word 'Humour', what comes to your mind?




- -You can create your own jokes (yes including dad jokes, as Miss Attalia loves them)



Are we all creative in the same way?







At Manor Primary we enjoy celebrating children's creativity through sharing things they have done at school and from home.



• We like to link this to 'Growth Mindset'.




Examples:

- Happiness is love and peace inside







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
British Values

<u>Democracy</u>- where people have a say in their country or community.

Rule of law- A set of rules that everyone conforms to.

Mutual respect and Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs-Where everyone is treated with kindness and respect regardless of age, race, gender, ethnicity or religion.

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


How is this taught?




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How can I support my child at home?

Celebration newsletter- each month a newsletter with examples of what work has been completed in school and quotes from our children explaining what that value means to them.


Discussions- talking to your children whenever a value lends itself.
