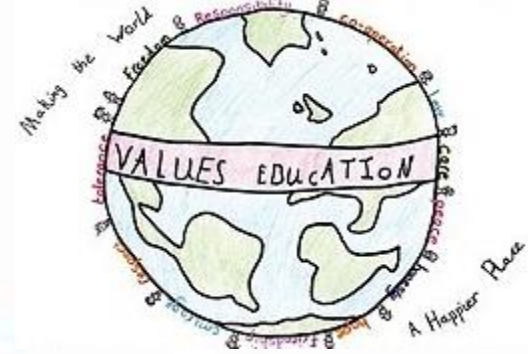


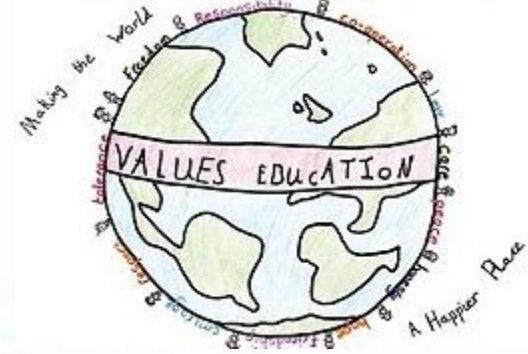

**Values-based Education (VbE) is a successful worldwide transformational movement for positive change.**

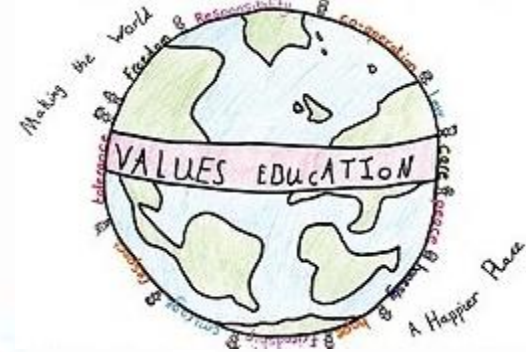


## Our School Vision

Children respect themselves, their friends and adults. They think about their own words and how this may hurt other's feelings.

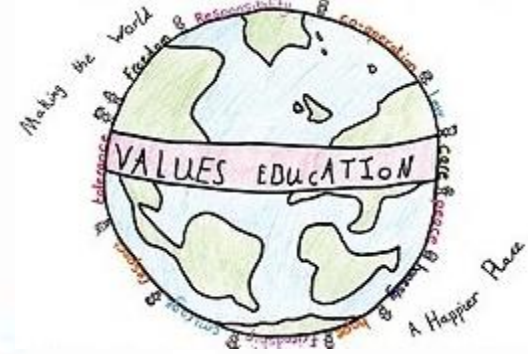
Children are tolerant of everyone in their world regardless of gender, race, ethnic background of disability.

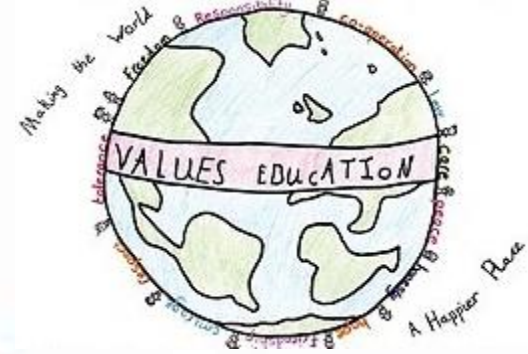

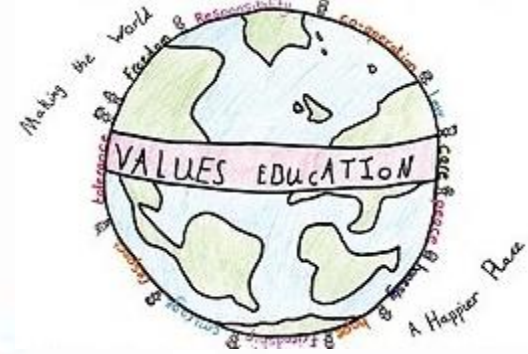

# Humour

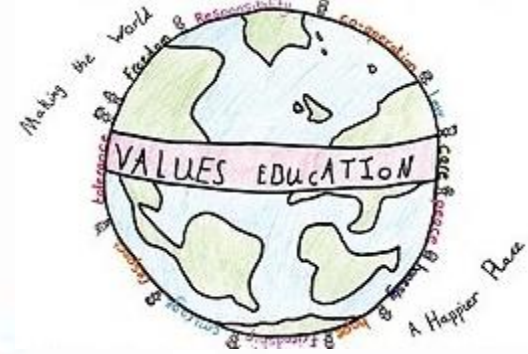


KS2 example

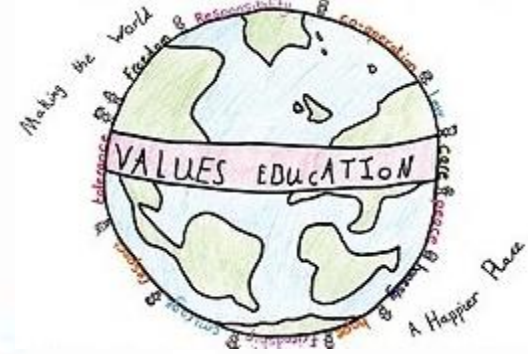
- What can you do at home?

- To extend their learning as KS2 children you could ask them to include figurative language, i.e. alliteration and similes.



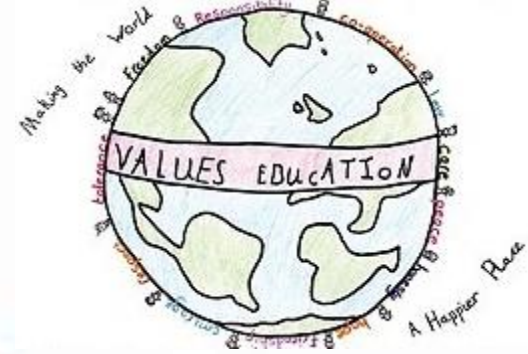




**Spend some time exploring different ways of being creative. Some examples are:**

- sculpting**

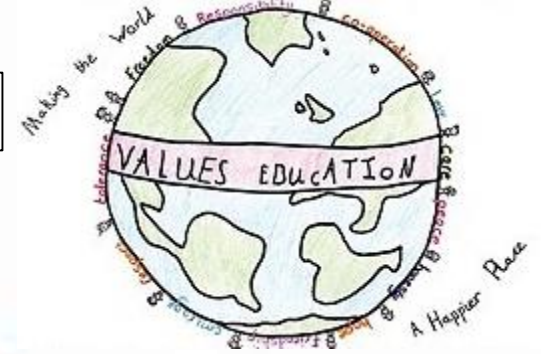
# Creativity

At Manor Primary we enjoy celebrating children's creativity through sharing things they have done at school and from home.

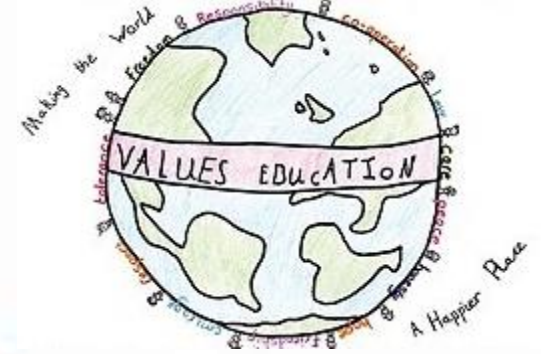

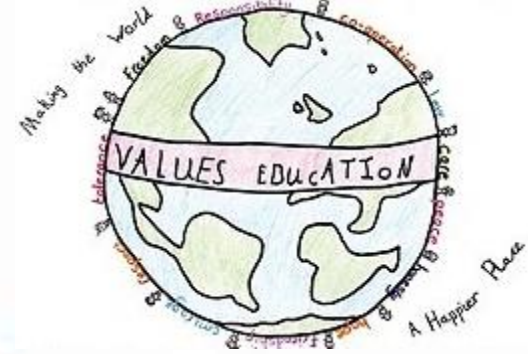

## Examples:

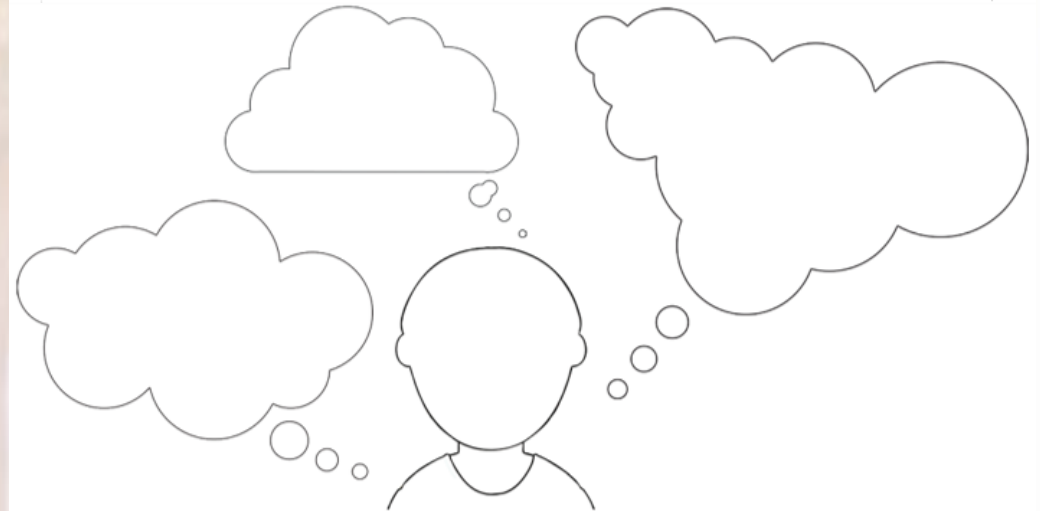
- Feeling or showing pleasure or contentment

- Happiness is love and peace inside

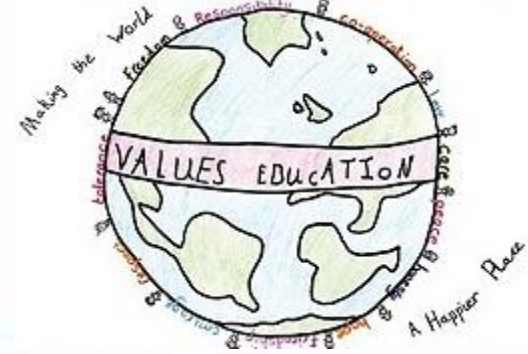

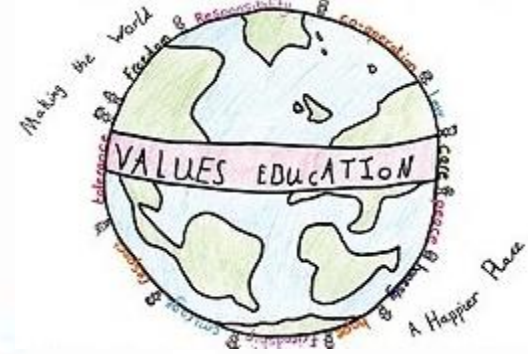
- What you could do at home:

## British Values

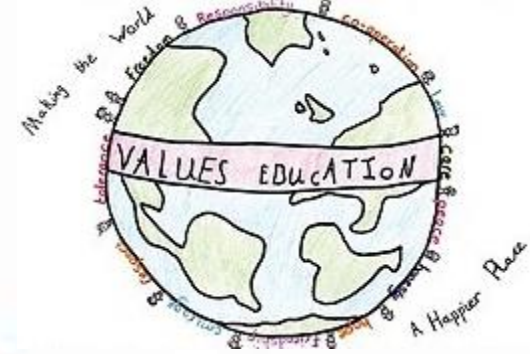
Democracy- where people have a say in their country or community.

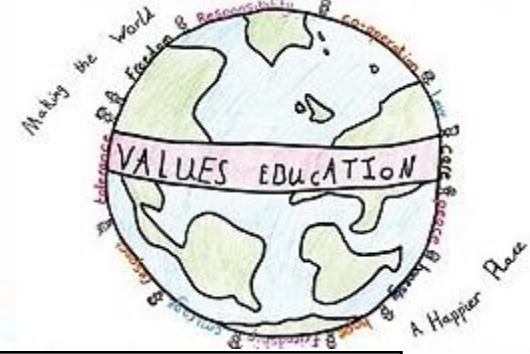

## **Individual liberty and freedom for all**

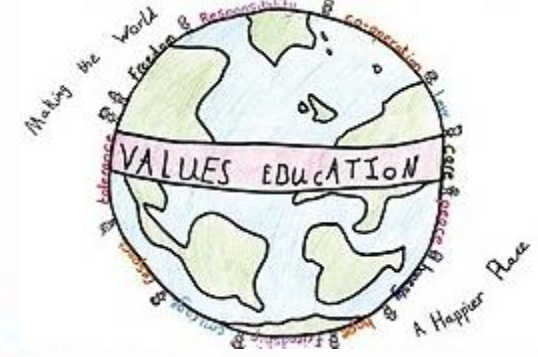
- Discussion time in all subjects.

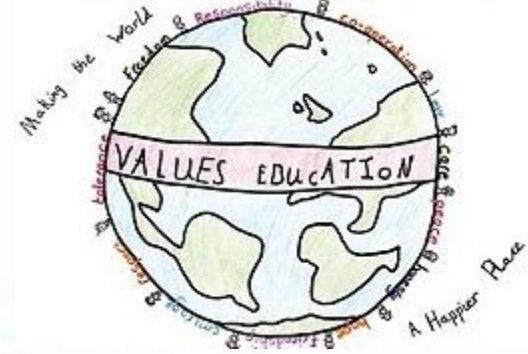

## How can I support my child at home?

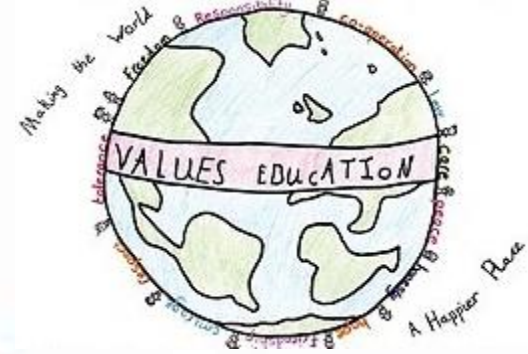
**Read newsletters-** each newsletter has the month's value on it and suggestions of activities or discussions you can do at home with your child.
